We have updated our Sixth Form Attendance Guidance with a new staged procedure to support our Sixth Form students in raising their attendance. The expectation is that students will attend at least 96% of the time so that they maximise their learning time and achieve their full potential. The new system allows us to identify students who need support early on, and put the relevant interventions in place. We acknowledge the impact medical needs and additional needs have on attendance and we have ensured that this system is inclusive and means that students are being supported at the right level as quickly as possible.
